



CINAHL

Coverage

CINAHL covers the literature of nursing and allied health professionals, including periodical literature from about 1,200 periodicals from 1982 to the present. Also included are health-related books, book chapters, pamphlets, pamphlet chapters, dissertations and master's theses, audiovisuals, and software. *CINAHL* is generally considered a non-full text index, however there is very limited full text available, primarily from non-scholarly state nursing association newsletters.

To Access

From the library's home page, <http://www.lib.csusb.edu/>, click "Articles or Journals" under "Search For." Select the letter "C," then select *CINAHL Plus with Full Text*. From home, you will need to have your Coyote OneCard student ID to connect.

To Search

- Type your search terms in using an "and" between words.

Find: <input type="text" value="wounds and diabetes"/>	<input type="button" value="Search"/>
--	---------------------------------------

- Phrases should be placed inside quotation marks.
- Use truncation (*), such as diabet* to retrieve diabetes, diabetic, diabetics, etc.
- Use the wildcard (?) to retrieve a single missing letter, such as wom?n for woman or women.

To View Results

- There is very little full text. Some articles will have a link that says "Linked Full Text," which will provide full text. However, most articles require users to click the "Search for Full Text" button to search for the text in other databases.

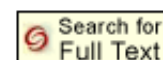


To Print/E-mail/Save

- For those with linked full text, click on the link, then choose the .pdf link. You may then print, email, or save the file.
- For items with no linked full text, you may only print the citation and abstract information in the *CINAHL* database.

To Find the Full Text using SFX

- If the article is not full text or linked full text, click the "Search for Full Text" button.
- A new window will appear informing you if the article is available in full text in another database.



- If it is available, click the “Go” button to retrieve it.
- To print from another database, follow that database’s printing instructions.
- If it is not available, click the “Go” button under “Library Holdings” to search for the article in paper in the 3rd floor periodicals collection.
- If we do not own it, consider interlibrary loan. Click the “Go” button and fill in the form. Many articles can be delivered via your ILL account in a few days.

To Find Similar Articles

- To find the articles this researcher used for their paper, click the “Cited References” link. This is their bibliography.
- To find people who have used this article for their research, click the “Times Cited in this Database” link. Both will help gather citations for literature reviews and for a thorough understanding of the topic.
